Three Bushes to Plant For Increased Home Security

Many home security solutions are on the market today that are designed to protect your home from intrusion, monitor for emergency events, and give you the peace of mind that someone is watching over your family. An often overlooked area of home security is the landscaping of our homes.



Planting a bush or shrub near windows that are possible entry points can be a big deterrent for potential intruders. There are many potential thorny shrubs or bushes that can be used for your landscaping. Three of these are Berberis, Rosa Rugosa, and Pyracantha.

A berberis bush is also known as a Pepperidge bush or barberry. There are over 400 species of this shrub which all have thorny shoots making it perfect choice for secure landscaping. Berberis plants have leaves that vary from 1 - 10 centimeters long with thorns. Some species have leaves that will turn color and fall while others remain green all year long. Different species will produce either flowers or berries. Both forms of this plant are a beautiful addition to any home landscaping. Consider the color of the flower or berry to determine whether it will be a good fit for your home landscaping.

Rosa rugosa is also known as Japanese Rose, Ramanas Rose, or Rugas Rose. This plant is from eastern Asia and is a common ornamental plant in North

America. Rosa rugosa grows very dense with tall stems and straight thorns. It will grow to 1 - 1.5 meters tall. It has large leaves and produces flowers that range from white to dark pink in color. This shrub will bloom in later summer or autumn with a sweet scent. Other common names for this plant are saltspray rose and beach rose.

Pyracantha, also known as Firethorn, is a very common plant used in gardens and landscaping. It is originally from Asia but many hybrid varieties have been developed since its introduction to North America. This evergreen shrub grows very tall with thorny leaves. A white flower typically is produced by firethorn accompanied with berries in varied tones of yellow, orange or red.

Landscaping adjustments should never be considered your only home security option. Adding thorny bushes to your landscaping should be used to supplement your existing security solution. If you do not have a home security system currently installed you should consider investing in one to protect your home, family, and valuables.

How Safe is Your Bedroom?

You probably think of your bedroom as a safe haven, a place where you can get away from it all and relax. But like anywhere else, your bedroom may contain a number of potential safety hazards. With a little care, however, you can minimise these risks and sleep peacefully at night knowing you and your family are safe. Here we explore some of the hidden dangers and what you can do to avoid them.



Fire safety in the bedroom

The most common cause of fires in the bedroom is smoking in bed, as it's so easy to fall asleep holding a lit cigarette. Smoking in bed should be heavily discouraged. However, if your partner or another relative insists on smoking in bed despite your warnings, provide them with a deep, heavy ashtray that can't easily be knocked over. If your mattress and bedding is very old, check whether it is flame retardant and replace it if it's not.

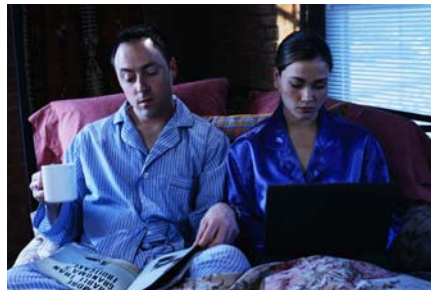
Candles are a wonderful way to create romance in the bedroom, but they are also a fire hazard. Try using candle lanterns, which are available in many shapes, sizes and styles. These will keep your candles safe even if you fall asleep. Never use candles in children's bedrooms or allow them to play with them.

To protect your family from fires at night, install a smoke alarm on the upstairs floor, preferably on the landing where everyone can hear it. Smoke alarms cost very little and can be found in most DIY and electrical stores. The batteries should be checked every week and replaced once a year. Keep a fire extinguisher on the landing, too.

If your property doesn't have access to a fire escape, consider getting a portable fire escape ladder, which folds away for easy storage in the bedroom. The ladder hooks onto the wall outside your window, allowing you to escape from your room if trapped by a fire.

Electrical equipment in the bedroom

Most of us have bedrooms full of electrical appliances - computers, TVs, hairdryers, lamps, stereos, and so on. We tend to assume it's safe to leave them switched on all night, and yet all it takes is one old or poorly wired plug to start a fire. Watch out for hot plugs and sockets, fuses that blow frequently, or scorch marks on sockets or plugs, as these indicate loose wiring that needs to be fixed. Get an electrician to check the wiring in your house and to make sure your electrical appliances are safe.



Don't overload electrical sockets and adaptors, as too many appliances plugged in at once can lead to overheating. The total current used by the appliances plugged into the adapter should not exceed 13 amps, or 3,000 watts of power. Never run more than one appliance that uses a lot of current, for example a kettle or television, from one socket. And don't place cables or plugs

anywhere where they could get wet.

When you're not using your electrical appliances, switch them off at the wall, unless the appliance is designed to be on all the time, e.g. an alarm clock. Don't leave electric cables where you could trip over them, and keep electric heaters well away from curtains, bedding and furniture. Lastly, if you use trailing sockets to move power from a wall socket to another point in the room, secure the cable to the skirting to prevent yourself or anyone else tripping over it.

Other safety hazards in the bedroom

Security is a further issue to consider when it comes to making your bedroom safe. Many people put locks on their ground floor windows but don't bother with those upstairs. Unfortunately a determined burglar will be prepared to climb onto a flat roof or up a drainpipe to get into your house. So if your bedroom window is in a vulnerable position, get some key-operated locks fitted. If you have young children, you may also want to install child-proof opening restrictors to prevent him or her from opening the windows too far.

Most other risks in your bedroom can be reduced with a little common sense. Worn out carpets or bedrooms full of clutter put you at risk of tripping over in the dark. Hot drinks should be handled with care when sitting in bed to prevent scalding. Finally, cleaning your bedroom regularly will prevent exposing yourself to

the potential dangers from dust and germs.

If someone was to break into the garage area, the rest of your home would be at a lesser risk with additional locks on the door to your home.

Place bars or cages over entry doors that have large glass panels. This can help to prevent burglars from breaking through the glass and entering your home.

Sliding doors should always be locked and barred, for extra security. Even those on upper floors can be accessed with ladders or fire escapes. Be sure that the door is not easily lifted off its track.

Even if the entry doors of your home are secure, be sure to have sturdy locks on garages, sheds and gates to keep an opportunity from presenting itself to a criminal. By keeping them away from the entries to your home,

you decrease the chance that they will come up with a creative way of entering your home.

There are many other things that need to be taken into consideration when handling home security issues, but by starting with securing your doors, you can increase the security of your home quickly. What is Lock Bumping?

Lock bumping might be referred to as lock picking's lesser known cousin. It's an unfamiliar term at best. It is, however, at least as big a problem as lock picking, and perhaps even more sinister for what it entails. Bumping is a type of lock picking. Instead of using typical lock picking tools though, all that is required is the use of a bump key. It has, for this reason, the potential to be much more sinister than lock picking.

One of the biggest problems is that few locks are immune from lock bumping. This is because most locks work on the same principle. The most common type of lock, found on every home and business in the world, is the pin-and-tumbler lock. To understand how lock bumping works, it helps to understand how a pin and tumbler system functions.



Inside every pin and tumbler lock is a cylinder (or *key cylinder*.) Within the cylinder is a chamber (the *plug*) containing stacks of pins. The pins it contains vary in length. When the correct key is inserted into the cylinder, the ridges or teeth on the key match the pins inside. Rotating the key causes the pins to spring apart and the plug to rotate. This rotation releases the latch from the door jamb.

Trying to insert the wrong key will produce one of two results. Either the key will not enter the cylinder at all, or, it will enter the cylinder, but won't be able to rotate the plug because the match is incorrect.

Old-school lock picking usually requires a broad range of tools. Lock bumping, in contrast, requires only one special key. A lock bump key looks like an ordinary door key. It would be unlikely to draw any suspicion, were it to be used to gain illegal entry to a home or business.

To the untrained eye, a bump key might pass for a regular key. A closer inspection, though, would reveal that the teeth (or ridges) and the notches are even. All of the cuts, in fact, are made to maximum depth. They may also be referred to as "dummy keys" or "999" keys. The number "999" is derived from the fact that the

cuts are all made to a depth of nine.

Opening a door lock with a 999 key isn't as simple as simply inserting and turning. It does take a particular feel and a certain degree of practice, just as old-fashioned lock picking does. What is alarming about lock bumping is that only two tools are required: a 999 key and a small "bump tool." A would-be criminal will draw much less attention to himself with a bump key than with a set of locksmithing tools.



Two other major factors increase the likelihood that home and business or commercial property owners will become the target of a lock bumper:

1) Lock bumping can be learned from the Internet. Unfortunately, the World Wide Web is rife with how-to video teaching this practice.

2) Bump keys can be purchased relatively easily over the Internet. It's almost as easy as finding how-to videos. Home and

business owners are left in a vulnerable position.

However, there are things property owners can do to protect themselves:

- * Use a deadbolt lock in addition to a cylindrical or other type of door lock. Deadbolt locks are much harder to bump than other types of [locks](#). Using both types has long been advised by locksmiths and security experts anyway. This is just one more good case for doing so.

- * Use an after market product. Anti-bumping products can be purchased at hardware stores and online. They are almost always worth the expense for the extra protection they provide.

- * Purchase anti-bump locks. Many lock manufacturers have come to recognize the magnitude of the problem. They have begun to produce locks with extra anti-pick and anti-bump features built right in.

By employing one or more of these methods, property owners may decrease their chances of becoming victims of *lock bumping* by fifty percent or more.

Choosing the Right Fire Safes For Your Home Or Business

Fire safes are designed to protect their contents from damage during a fire. There are several factors to consider when choosing fire safes, with the fireproof rating assigned to the safe being the most important.



The fireproof rating gives an indication of how well the fire safes will protect the contents from damage under actual fire conditions. The rating is usually expressed in minutes or hours. For example, a 1 hour 350 degree F rating means that the fire safes have been exposed to a 1700 degree F fire for a period of 1 hour, and that the temperature inside the safes did not rise above 350 degrees F. The 350 degree F number is a low enough temperature to protect documents and other fairly durable items from permanent damage.

If you need to protect more delicate valuables or electronic

backup media, there are fire safes available that have a special media rating. A media rating is determined in the same manner as a regular fireproof rating, except that the temperature inside the fire safes must not rise above 125 degrees F. In addition, since electronic backup media is subject to damage due to water, a media rating indicates that the humidity inside the fire safes will not rise above 80% during fire conditions. The test includes using water to put out the fire.

Another factor to consider when choosing fire safes is the burglary rating. Not all fire safes are burglary rated. The burglary rating gives an indication of how long it would take to break into the safe. Usually specified in minutes, the burglary rating for fire safes gives the amount of time that it would take an experienced locksmith to break into the safe using common locksmith's tools. The higher the burglary rating, the more secure the fire safe.

There are a number of other factors to consider when choosing fire safes. One factor is the locking mechanism that is used to lock the safe. Available types of locks include traditional mechanical combination dials, mechanical keylocks, electronic keypad locks, and biometric locks. The electronic keypad type of locking mechanism is much more convenient than the mechanical dial or keylock type. With an electronic keypad lock, the user simply enters the combination to the safe on a PIN pad, similar to the ones used on ATM and debit machines. This causes the lock to release on the

safe. Consider fire safes with a biometric lock for even more security and convenience. A biometric lock uses a fingerprint scanner to grant access to the safe. The user simply places their index finger on the scanner, and the safe opens if the fingerprint is a match.



Fire safes that use electronic locks usually allow several different users to be given access to the safe. This feature usually comes with the ability to view an audit trail, showing who accessed the safe and at what times. This data is usually viewed on a built-in display panel or uploaded to a personal computer for viewing.

As you can see, there are a number of factors to consider when choosing fire safes. To ensure that you make the right choice, choose an experienced safe and vault company to do business with. They can help you select the right safe for you from among a wide variety of fire safes.

Install Commercial Photo Controls For Lighting to Beef Up Your Company's Security

Every business building needs a substantial amount of light during night hours for security purposes. Commercial buildings such as plants or warehouses that cater to second or third shift workers need adequate lighting outdoors for employees as they enter and leave the building and parking lot or garage. But before you rush out to look for lighting solutions, consider installing commercial photo controls for better security and to save on costs.

Commercial Photo Controls Eliminate Hassle while Saving Energy

As a business owner, you might be tempted to install the first lights you find such as bright

flood lights or wallpacks, which are small lights that hang flat against a building wall. These lights not only cause a lot of glare, but also waste much energy. You will likely need to turn them on and off manually, which can be a real hassle. Even with lights that are set on a timer, they'll have to be reset for every seasonal change. The timer for lighting won't always be synchronized with dawn and dusk, which wastes energy by the lights being left on during daylight hours.

Commercial photo controls differ in that the controls work by sensing natural light, and will turn on automatically when the sun goes down because of the lack of natural light. When the sun rises again in the morning, commercial photo controls will detect an increase of natural light, and will subsequently turn off automatically. This means that once you install commercial photo controls for lighting, you won't have to worry about turning the lights on and off manually, or about setting a timer for the lights at every turn of the season.

Your business will save on energy costs by installing commercial photo controls because the lights will remain on only during night hours. Commercial photo controls also work with compact fluorescent light (CFL), which saves even more energy. Fluorescent photo controls will extend the life of bulbs, which can reduce lighting expenses for your business tremendously. CFL bulbs can fit into existing light fixtures, and they use less wattage for the same amount of lighting when

compared with traditional incandescent lamps. CFL bulbs also last much longer so you won't have to change your light bulbs as often.

Where to Install Commercial Photo Controls

Develop a lighting plan that maximizes security while providing adequate lighting for employees while entering or leaving the building. Even if your business doesn't operate on second or third shifts, employees will need sufficient lighting when going out after first shift once Daylight Savings ends because it will get dark much earlier.



The lighting should be installed at every entrance/exit as well as each window to deter burglary. Burglars usually look for a dark window or door where they can easily access it without being seen. The photo control lighting needs to be out of reach so burglars can't remove or destroy your fixtures. Also, add plenty of light throughout parking areas and walkways. Light up important signs as well as outdoor break areas for employees.

When installing lamps for parking areas or walkways, be sure to use shielded fixtures to prevent up-light and glare. Fixtures that are well shielded help you light a larger area

because the light is cast downward and dispersed sideways so the light will not be wasted.
